The AHS library sponsored a fantasy writing contest during the month of December. AHS students were invited to compose an original fantasy short story of no more than five pages, typed and double-spaced. The contest flyer provided the following information to students, along with the contest rules:

Fantasy is genre of fiction that commonly uses magic and other supernatural phenomena as a primary plot element, theme, or setting. Many works within the genre take place in imaginary worlds where magic is common. Fantasy is generally distinguished from the genre of science fiction by the expectation that it steers clear of scientific themes, though there is a great deal of overlap between the two.
