We provide one personal computer and internet connection for every two students.

44% of Allegheny County teachers hold advanced degrees.

Our staff includes two National Board Certified Teachers.

45% of the students in the Class of 2006 earned an advanced studies diploma

The school division is one of only 25 in the state of Virginia to make AYP in all schools and at the division level.

The VAESP 2002 “Distinguished Principal of the Year” is a member of our administrative staff.

Our superintendent received the 2005 Curriculum & Instructional Leadership Award from the Virginia Children’s Engineering Convention.

Over 25% of Allegheny High School students participate in the marching band.

The school division coordinates a three-year teacher mentor program to nurture, coach and support all first-year teachers.

98% of all teachers in the division are “highly qualified” according to NCLB standards in Virginia.

The Allegheny High School art instructor was named the 2004 Virginia Art Education Association Southwest Region Teacher of the Year

115 students at AHS were enrolled in AP and/or dual enrollment courses in 2006

All district schools maintain a registered nurse on site at least 4.5 hours per day.

The AHS Destination Imagination team competed in the Global Competition after placing 2nd in the state competition.

A total of 346 scores of 600 were earned by students on the Virginia Standards of Learning assessments in 2006.

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
